

Adams wins title

Lathrup matmen 2nd in MSAA

Southfield-Lathrup's 145-pound wrestler Chris Parent became the first four-time league champion Saturday as he won the Metro Suburban Activities Association title at Rochester Adams.

However, most of the thunder belonged to the Highlanders as Adams scored a meet record of 25 1/2 points in winning its sixth consecutive league championship. The previous record was 18 1/2 by Adams in 1981.

Lathrup was second with 158 points, followed by Birmingham Groves (99), Bloomfield Hills Lahser (95 1/2), Troy Athens (79) and Royal Oak Dondoro (47).

The results of the league meet, coupled with the standings from the dual meets, put Adams on top in the

overall standings, followed by Lathrup, Groves, Athens, Lahser and Dondoro.

In the league meet, Adams sent 12 of its 13 wrestlers into the finals, and nine came out with championships. Highlander Ron Schimion, who wrestles at 198 pounds and heavyweight, won his third consecutive league heavyweight title with an 8-5 decision over Groves' Mike Basso.

PARENT, WHO pinned his first two opponents in less than four minutes, wrestled in the championship match with a sprained ankle, an injury he sustained in his previous match. Despite the injury, Parent (42-2) dethroned Adams' Mike Angeli, 22-7, for the championship. Angeli got to the finals

with two pins in a combined time of 85 seconds.

Adams won the first four classes in the finals. Derek Adragan (98 pounds) posted a 5-1 decision over Lathrup's Jeff Wong, and Steve Clark (105) pinned Groves' Jon Abrahams in 2:25.

At 112 pounds, Brad Vargas pinned Groves' Andy Brindling in 2:21, and Kevin DeBolt (119) won by forfeit against Lathrup's Jon Krome.

Adams picked up another first from Joe Thompson (132) as he edged Lathrup's Bill Rose, 4-1. Harry Wasvary (155) nipped Lathrup's Sam Schwartz, 11-10, Mike Fender (167) blanked Athens' George Papadellis, 12-0, and Barney Jacob (198) pinned Groves' Scott Taylor in 1:39.

In addition to Parent's title, Lathrup's Tom Kopsch and Allen Weiner were crowned champions. Kopsch won the 128-pound title with a 15-3 victory over Adams' Craig Grant, and Weiner was a champ at 138 with an 8-5 decision over Dondoro's Dan Bonar.

Lahser's Larry Wolfson (185) was the only champ who wasn't from either Adams or Lathrup. He dethroned Adams' Jeb Stollcker, 12-7, to win the title.

SOUTHFIELD HIGH came away from Lincoln Park's 17-team invitational Saturday with a third-place finish behind champion Dearborn Heights Robichaud and runnerup Monroe.

N. Farmington gymnasts sparkle

Kim Edwards finished first in three events and placed second in another Monday to pace North Farmington's 112.8-95.5 gymnastics victory over Plymouth Salem. North owns a 10-1 record.

Edwards won vaulting (8.50), balance beam (8.05) and floor exercise (8.50) and finished second (8.05) behind teammate Angie Griffin (8.25) on uneven parallel bars.

North's Dona Kebrde finished second on beam (7.25) and took a third on bars (7.75). Salem's Beth Ruffall earned second in vaulting (7.45) and floor exercise (7.90). Teammate Sara Michalik finished third in vaulting (7.00).

North is home to Northville Feb. 23, a Wednesday. The meet has a 7 p.m. start.

FARMINGTON HARRISON'S Jill Birsu won the uneven parallel bars with a score of 6.8, but her team fell to Walled Lake Western, 101.2-99.9, in another girls' gymnastics contest. Harrison has a 4-7 record.

Birsu also earned a second on beam (7.40) to go with thirds in vaulting (7.25) and floor exercise (7.75). Harrison's Julie Runk and Western's Lisa Rosselle tied for first in floor exercise (7.95). Terry

Lowell of Western won vaulting (7.35), and teammate Maria Hughes won beam (7.50).

On Feb. 23, Harrison is home to Walled Lake Central. The meet has a 7 p.m. start.

SOUTHFIELD-LATHRUP made it eight gymnastics victories in a row Monday with a 117.15-103.85 win over Berkley.

Sophomore Lana Horowitz won all four events, scoring an 8.60 in vaulting, a 9.0 in uneven parallel bars, an 8.65 on balance beam and an 8.95 in floor exercise. Teammate Jenny Scranon placed second on beam (7.85) and floor exercise (8.10). Laura Sheets of Lathrup finished third in vaulting (7.50) and beam (7.65).

Berkley's Penny Phillips was second in vaulting (7.50) and had thirds on bars (7.75) and floor (7.65).

Lathrup competes at Bloomfield Hills Lahser Thursday evening.

ANDOVER'S AMY Nadler was really on the beam — and the other three events as well — Monday to help the Barons beat Ferndale, 115.55-88.80.

In the Southeastern Michigan Association. For Andover, the score was the second regional qualifier of the season.

Andrea Della-Torre of Andover placed third in vaulting (8.95), and teammate Karen Berger was third on beam (8.75).
