The name of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's most recent guest conductor is familiar to many listeners.

This isn't just because his grandfather, Ernst von Dohnanyi, was a leading and internationally acclaimed Hungarian composer, Christoph von Dohnanyi is by now a recognized conductor world-wide in his own right.

This reputation has been recently reaffirmed by his appointment as music director of the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra, starting in the 1984-85 season, which proves that at least at one place the notorious year "1984" is not going to be a total disaster.

IN HIS DEBUT here, Dohnanyi demonstrated his musical versatility by proving to be equally adept with composers as diverse as Mozart and Stravinsky. The two Mozart compositions on the program were the Symphony No. 25 in G Minor and the Concerto No. 24 for Piano and Orchestra in C minor, K. 491.

The second portion of the program consisted of a single work — Stravinsky's music to the ballet "Petrushka." Guest pianist was the young, gifted and German-born Gerhard Oppitz.

The Symphony No. 25, in spite of its advanced numerical designation compared to most other composers, was written when Mozart was only 17. This young age, however, isn't reflected in its mature and profound outline.

This is Mozart's earliest symphony that is part of the familiar repertoire — most of the earlier ones are almost never performed today.

In this performance Dohnanyi showed a keen awareness of the composition's subtle structure. A case in point was his emphasis on the counterpoint of the lower strings in the second theme of the first movement.

My only issue with this performance was his disposition to strike the grace notes in the minuet abruptly and before the beat. There is ample evidence to suggest that such notes were customarily played on the beat during the baroque and early post-baroque periods, with a longer duration, which seems to be more appropriate. But this is doomed to be one of those unresolved issues.

THE PIANO CONCERTO No. 24, which is the only one among Mozart's 27 concerti which is in the common key of C minor, is regarded by many as among his best, possibly his very best.

Unlike many compositions for a solo instrument, this composition gives the piano and orchestra almost equal roles, a feature that has been duly recognized by pianist Oppitz.

His presentation stressed the integration of the themes with the orchestra and was artistically subtle rather than flamboyant. In subjugating himself to the music, Oppitz elevated himself to the level of a truly mature and gifted musician.

One can seldom hear a presentation of "Petrushka" which is as satisfying as this one. Like some of Stravinsky's other scores, this music is very complex, written for a large orchestra, with assorted instruments. But with Dohnanyi in complete command, no single note was wasted.

The beauty of the music was manifested in all its rich and colorful sounds. The numerous solo instrumental passages were superbly played by the individual players, without exception.

All the instrumental sections were perfectly coordinated and integrated, resulting in scenes that were so clear and vivid, almost as if they were actually performed on the stage. This doesn't suggest, however, that the actual ballet performance is redundant.

Stravinsky himself, who was skeptical of the notion of "interpretation," stressed the importance of faithfully reproducing the composer's wishes. In this respect, one could hardly do any better.
