

Cranbrook triumphs, 57-41

It's payback time for Lahser

It was payback time for Lahser High School Friday night.

Lahser defeated Birmingham Groves, 57-41, to wrap up second place in the Light Metro Suburban Activities Association (MSAA) race. Groves, which had defeated Lahser earlier this season, finished with a third-place tie with Rochester Adams and Troy Athens.

Southfield-Lathrup won the league with an 8-2 mark, followed by Lahser (6-4), Adams, Athens and Groves (5-5) and Dondora (1-9). Lahser has an overall 11-6 record.

"It was fantastic! Let's face it," said Lahser coach Mike Fedio, "Groves beat us by 11 at their place, so to come back it was really something."

Lahser trailed by one point at half-time and by two points (44-42) going into the final quarter. The Knights won it with a 15-9 scoring advantage over the final eight minutes.

Tim Haynes, a senior guard and one of the area's top scorers, mustered 22 points. Fellow guard Mike Davis had 15

points and five steals while sophomore Darren Munson had nine rebounds.

Groves' Mark McGrath scored a game-high 23 points and Curtis Campbell added 11 points.

Lahser hosts Clarkston tomorrow. Groves, 12-5 overall, plays at Dearborn tomorrow.

CRANBROOK received a 22-point performance from senior forward Adam Murphy to race past Oxford, 57-41.

The Cranes had a 16-4 advantage after the first quarter and played the Wildcats virtually even the rest of the way. Cranbrook made 21 baskets while Oxford countered with 17.

Erich Lines had nine points for the Cranes. Les Sparks added six assists and Murphy had 13 rebounds.

Cranbrook, 11-7 overall and 4-2 in the North Oakland Activities Conference, hosts Lutheran North tomorrow.

ST. MARY'S ran its record to 9-10 overall with a victory Friday over the

University of Detroit, 50-49.

John Frizzell hit a pair of free throws with 19 seconds left to account for the winning margin. Baglet teammates Steve Tompkins and Jeff Petrucci led the scoring with 15 and 12 points, respectively.

REGULAR PUBLIC HEARING**
February 22, 1983

Mayor Hughes opened the regular Public Hearing of the City Council of Farmington Hills on February 22, 1983 at 7:30 P.M. Members present were: Burwell, Wolf, Dolan, Hughes and Williams. Absent: Lange and Sorensen. Others present were: City Manager Savage, City Clerk Cairns and City Attorney Poehlman.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment C23-292 (ZR 15-11-43) to rezone land at 32400 Northwestern Highway in Section 2 from RA-2 to B-3.

Council adopted S&D Resolutions 2, 3 and 4 for Signs on Hugo Street in Krav's Grand River Heights Subdivision and set date of March 14th for Public Hearing. Structure at 21874 Whittington was determined to be unsafe. Council gave owner 30 days to demolish the structure and cap the basement, swimming pool and repair garage.

Council enacted Ordinance No. C-4-83, an Amendment to Personnel Regulations - Employees Retirement System, to include all full-time fire fighters of the Department of Public Safety, Division of Fire of the City of Farmington Hills.

Traffic Control Orders for Stop and Yield Signs at various intersections in Hollywood Subdivision were adopted.

Council voted to reconsider joint participation with City of Farmington concerning street lights along Farmington Road between 8 and 9 Mile Roads.

Helen Morris was appointed to the Board of Review.

Meeting adjourned at 9:10 P.M.
