Theater party to benefit NFHS's marching band

Fund raising continues to send North Farmington High School's marching band to competition in Toronto, Ont., with a theater party scheduled for 3 p.m. Saturday and Sunday March 19-20 in Farmington Players Barn Theater.

The afternoon matinee is "Domino Courts," a drama by William Haughton, which is the players' entry into

the Festival of American Community Theatres' state competition in late March.

"Ordinarily, this wouldn't be open to the public," said Emily McSweeney, "This is the Players way of helping us."

Members of North Farmington Band Boosters began raising money for the marching band's entry into the Interna-

tional Music Festival right after the first of the year when the band was accepted into the competition.

The boosters have since sold cases of grapefruit and oranges, staged an auction and continue the fund-raising with the theater party. The goal is \$20,000. The deadline is the middle of May.

"Domino Courts" is directed by Sharran Douglas. Its cast is composed of Joe Haynes, Yvonne Golomb, Danny Klees and Nancy Cleri. The drama is set in the dustbowl area of the United States in 1939.
