Claiming his work was "unsatisfactory," Master Jig officials lifted Brown the day after his confrontation with company president Randolph Vidergar, about employee benefits.

A JIG bore operator with the firm since November 1976, Frown didn't receive a written or verbal carbon and the president of the pres

Brown filed the labor violation complaint with the Detroit NLRB office shortly after his discharge in June 1931, Stevens said. When NLRB attorneys determined Master Jig violated the NLR Act, the case was prosecuted before Buschmann last September, the Detroit attorney said. Onsatisfied with Buschmann's ruling, company officials appealed to the NLRB in Washington D.C. and lost the case.

Established in the 1930s, the NLR Act was designed to protect workers who wanted to unlonize; signed to protect workers who wanted to unlonize; Stevens said. Over the years, however, the labor act

The firm's only legal option, Stevens said, is appealing the NLRB order before the 6th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Cincinatt. If Master Jig officials refuse to rehire Brown, Stevens said the will ask the Court of Appeals to enforce the NLRB order.
