# Catholic Central honors deceased student

Anton Marks attended Catholic Central High School for only two years, but in that short time he made an enduring impression.
Marks, who would have graduated this spring, is remembered by family, classmates and faculty as an outgoing, intelligent, active young man with a height smile who endeared himself to everyone who knew him. He died in June 1981 of heart disease at the age of 18.
Marks will be remembered in a special way this year. His parents, Canton Township residents Juck and Nadia Marks, have established a one-time only, \$1,000 scholarship in his memory. The Anton Marks Memoral Scholarship in his memory. The Anton Marks Memoral Scholarship will be given to the 1983 graduating senior who best

demonstrates scholastic ability and financial need for college.

"It's what we know our boy would have liked us to have done," Nadia Marks said. "We feel as though we could give it to someone else to pass on a memory of him.

IT'S FOR someone who is needy and still working very hard to try and keep good grades. It's to encourage kids to study, that's the real reason."

The special scholarship is the second established by the Marks family in memory of their only child. The lirst award, the Anton Marks Scholarship Fund, worth \$500, is given every fail to a needy ruident.

School officialis will look at seniors' financial need forms, filled out for college, and their grade point averages to determine who will receive the \$1,000 scholarship, according to the Rev. John Whitey, Catholic Central as-

sistant principal.

A plaque will be awarded to the scholarship winner. The plaque, a larger version of which will hang in the school, describer Anton as a "deepty loved friend, and a living incarnation of the Christian spirit," who "lived what he believed," Whittey said.

Born with a congenital heart defect, Anton used a motorized scooter to get to and from classes, Neverthelex he maintained a "tremendous" smile and friendly personality. Whittey said.
