

# RO police aid killed in county committee

A proposal to spend \$1 million from the Oakland County budget for police and fire protection in Royal Oak was turned down last week.

Members of the Oakland County Board of Commissioners' Public Services Committee rejected the proposal in a 4-3 vote. The vote effectively kills the proposal at this time.

**COMMITTEE** Chairman James E. Lanni, R-Royal Oak, said he introduced the proposal to help Royal Oak out of its budget crisis.

Republican Commissioners Thomas A. Law of West Bloomfield Township and George B. Jackson of Birmingham supported Lanni's proposal.

Opposing it were two other Republicans — Richard D. Kuhn Jr. of Independence Township and Susan G. Kuhn of Clawson — and two Democrats —

Walter Moore and Hubert Price, both of Pontiac. Lanni argued the expenditure was justified because communities in the south end of the county have been subsidizing those in the north end for a number of years.

Communities in the south end pay for county road patrol services which they don't use, he said. Road patrols are sent out to the northern end of county where communities don't have their own police departments.

**WHEN LANNI** introduced the proposal more than a week ago, some commissioners thought he was joking.

They argued that if Lanni could get \$1 million for Royal Oak, they should be able to get the same amount for their communities.

## Photography contest aids eye research

not come out of the foundation funds. Last year's contest with the theme "Gift of Sight" raised \$1,000 which the foundation gave to the Kresge Eye Institute together with an additional \$1,000.

First prize in last year's contest went to Michael Verbanek of Troy.

## 4 promoted to full prof

Representational painter Ed Levine's works are scheduled from 7-9 p.m. March 23 in Room 204 of E Building.

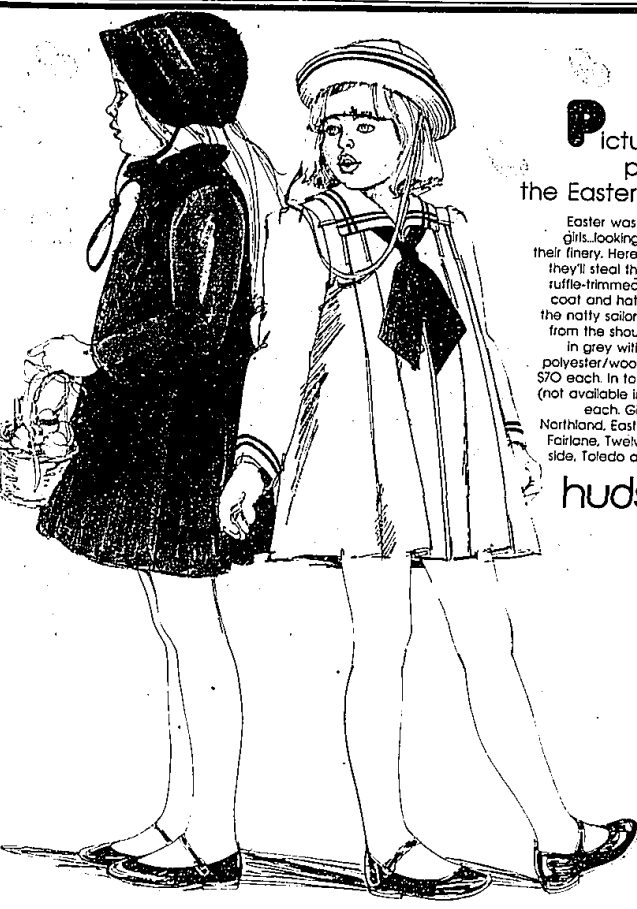
Stained glass artist Mark Talaba will be featured 7-9 p.m. April 4 in Room 204 of E Building.
