mg, and what would the effects be if I go back to 15 mg, too quickly? Also, can cortisone cause stomach bleeding and does alcohol interfere with the actions of my medications.

I really think your questions would be best answered by your family doctor. I do not know your past and present medical history, nor 0 I know what other medications you are taking. Your doctor can evaluate the severity of your attacks and advise you on decreasing dosage of your cortisone.

As to your question of whether cortisone can cause stomach bleeding, the answer is yes, but rarely, when the use of the medication is closely watched by a doctor.
