Shea, who made the O&E team last season, fin-ished 24th and 17th at the state meet in the slatom and glant slatom races, respectively. She was sec-ond in the glant slatom at the divisional race at Alpine Valley.

Siegol placed ninth at the state in giant slalom and 13th in slalom.
