Radiology chief named at Sinai

Wayne State hosts advisers seminar

Wayne State University will host a one-day conference for community college guidance counselors and advisers March 25 at the McGregor Center.

Theme for this year's conference is "High Education and Technology — A Formula for the Future."

WSU President David Adamany will give the opening address at 9 a.m. His topic will be, "WSU Relations with Michigan Community Colleges: New Directions for the Future."

Oakland Community College President Robert F. Roelofs will follow with a discussion on "One Community College's Effort to Meet the Growing Needs of High Technology."

The day's events will close with a panel by community college representatives on transfer of credits and other topics of concern.
