him residents were complaining about the "high rates." Instead, Early said, "they chose a non-profit company (CEMS) which charger more." According to the NAS and CEMS pro-posals, documented in the ad hoc com-mittee's report, a patient suffering a heart attack, with emergency medical technicians (EMT) transporting him 10 miles, administering oxygen and charg-ing other emergency care fees, would pay \$185 with CEMS and \$150 with NAS.

CEMS WOULD PROVIDE three Ad-vanced Life Support Units (ALS) sta-tioned in Novi, Farmington and North-ville Township, Two basic units also would be stationed in Novi 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. seven days a week. The other would be at Bosisford 7 pm. to 7 a.m. If all four communities approve the CEMS proposal, more details will be worked out for the proposed five-year
