

MORE IMPORTANT, Sonnenschein said, than what ahe bad in mind as she creates, is what the viewer sees and feels about her work.

"Whether It's negative or positive, I just hope the viewer has some feelings about my work, she said.

The only hint she gave of the meaning of any of her sculptures concerned "Life Screen."

"Both sides are different. One is poured, the other is not, it is smooth and more fragile. 'Life screen' teaches about the two sides of life.'

Since moving to this area with a family that includes a husband and two children, Sonnenschein has become active in many community organizations.

She has shown with and is an active member of CADE, a Detrolot-based organization of contemporary artists. A native of New Jersey, she studied at Rutgers University, and the Art Students League and School of Visual Arts of New York City.

She was determined to make the best of a move from Chicago to this area that at Iirst seemed disastrous. She said the move has been rewarding for both her career and her family life.
