1 month left to get a deal

More than 10,000 MichCon residential customers have received interest-free loans to install ceiling insulation and furnace retrofit devices since June 1981.

The two-year program, made possible by Michigan Public Act 211 of 1978, expires in June after providing more than \$3.8 million in loans.

Only qualifying MichCon customers can use the loans for furnace retrofit devices, which the company pioneered, and ceiling insulation. "MichCon customers who still wish to participate in the Interest-Free Loan Program should apply before May 2, 1983," said Devere Elgas, director of energy conservation for MichCon. Insulation six inches thick (R-19) is recommended for houses in Michigan, although most older houses have less than that amount. The loans in amounts up to \$1,000 can be used to bring insulation up to the six-inch level. Ceiling insulation is calculated to save from 5 to 20 percent in gas consumption. Retrofit devices can cut consumption from 7 to 10 percent. Loans of up to \$500 are available for retrofit devices.

Accelerated Latin class begins in May

St. Mary's College is offering an accelerated course in Latin May 9 through June 11. The course places special emphasis on the vocabulary found in theological and scriptural texts. It will prepare students who need Latin in pursuit of studies in theology.

Using the approach sometimes called "whole brain learning," the course offers training in the language which makes use of deep relaxation sessions in which students play an important role. Most of the class time is spent in becoming familiar with Latin through lengthy dialogues which incorporate all the basic structure of the language as well as 2,000 vocabulary items.

Class size is limited to 15 persons. For registration information, call 682-1885.

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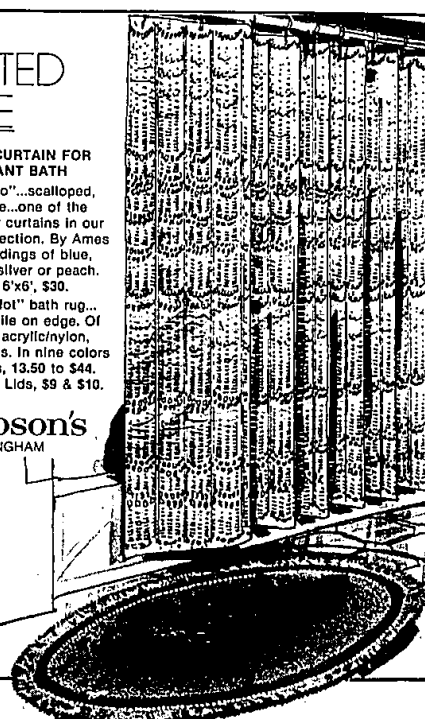
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
