Classical artists excel on record

For those record collectors who are interested in something other than yet another recording of the standard pleces by a known conductor or artist, there are two records available by artists feer are results.

These feature delightful selections that are seldom heard. The quality of the musical performance on these recordings is uncompromisingly high.

Shaul Ben-Melr has been a fluist with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra since 1987. Considering the fact that he was a student of the celebrated fluist Jean Pierre Hampal, one may conclude that he must have been a very good student.

But, more importantly, he has his own statement to make. On the Golden Crest record, he is accompanied by Muriel Kilby, who has appeared as solosit with some leading orchestras. Presently he is a keyboard player with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra (as a non-solo orchestra member), and she participates in many local chamber events.

THIS RECORDING leatures compositions by Hindemith, Eldin Burton, Michel Blavet, Philippe Gaubert and Honegger. If the three middle compositions on this record are no less delightful.

Eldin Burton is an American composer, currently residing in New York, if Ind his Sanstilla for Fluite and Piano Michael Sanstilla for Fluite and Piano Hindemith Sonata No. 4 provides an interesting and rewarding than many compositions by better known contemporary composers.

Blavet (1700-1760) was a French baroque composer and flute player. His Sonata No. 4 provides an interesting in sight into the capabilities of the early list century instrument.

Philippe Gaubert (1879-1941) was a French composer known primarily for his flute compositions and arrangement of flute works by some of his more famous predecessors. The Hindemith sonata and the Honegger Danse de la Chevre are helpful in convincing the skeptic that there is musical life after the three Bs.

The high level of performance of both flute and plano of these compositions made in dead to be blessed with such arrisite mastery in our own domain.

drawback is the relatively weak signal, which necessitates a high level of volume, causing a higher level of static noise. While the noise is saidble, it isn't above acceptable level and the recording as a whole is very enjoyable.

The Megido record features, in addition to Ben-Meir, harpatichordist David Wilson and planist Michelle Cooker. Composers featured are C.P.E.Bach, Louis Ganne, Sigfried Karg-Elert, Frant Dopler, Saint Sears, Krantz and Fontbonne. The latest of these works is by Karg-Elert (1977-1933), with the familiar title Sonata Apassionata. While it is no match for the more famous Beethoven work with the same title, it is a rather articulated work for solo fute. The rest, with the exception of Bach's 'diamburg' Sonata, are rare romantic-era treats.


