to provide those funds for the continued operation of the library." Deadman said.

But Gordon Lewis, library director and ardent supporter of reorganiting the board as an authority, said the board could become "a separate governmental entity rather than the product of the two cities."

A second major reason prompting the reorganization issue, Lewis said, is that with two numicipal units now governing the library system, priorities at times are difficult to arrive at.

"Too many cooks spoll the stew," Lewis said.

Although revenue gleaned from an operating millage would be comparable to revenues the library now re-But Gordon Lewis, library director

ceives from the two cities, the library's income would be more stable with an operating millage, Lewis said.
"THE PRIORITIES are different sometimes between the two cities," Lewis said, adding that library funding at times fails to command a number one funding priority in Farmington and Farmington Hills.

Currently, both cities allocate money each year for the library's operation, Lewis said. Although Farmington Mayor Alton Bennett said the library board is free to do what it wishes with the money. Lewis said the city councils check the budget before it's put into operation.
