fanne Vicini lives in her house on ridan in Plymouth without the fear being arrested without a warant, ag tortured, or being forced into king false confessions. fet, each month Vicini's thoughts t efforts turn to people in South and

Central America where such activities allegedly take place.
Vicini is a member of Amnesty International's Urgent Action Network. Each month she writes letters to government ministers, embassies, leading newspapers and international organizations, calling for the release of selected persons. newspapers and international organiza-tions, calling for the release of selected persons.

"I felt called to answer Amnesty In-

ternational's challenge because I read in Jonathan Power's book (Amnesty In-ternational) that thousands in South America, in Central America, and in other world hot spots were suffering and dying, as in the time of Hitler," Vi-

Members of the township board also expressed concerns about proper land use for an arcade, traffic patterns and pedestrian safety at Ford and Lilley, a high-accident intersection.

The township board initially held up licensing approval for the arcade while considering possible changes to the mechanical devices ordinance. Akhtar and Baldwin last December filed a lawuit in Wayne County Circuit Court to force the township to immediately grant them a license.

Judge James Mies refused the request, saying township ordinances call for approval from both the planning commission and the township trustees. The judge urged the partners and township officials to work out their differences. A license was eventually granted.

Echevarren, 28, was arrested by Uruguayan security forces on March 18, 1983 in the Uruguayan town of Chuy on the Brasilian border, according to Amnesty International reports.

Amoesty International reports. ECHEVARREN WAS returning from a visit in Brazil with her sister, who was forced to leave Uruguay due to her work with a human rights organization. Fearing that Echevarren would be subjected to torture while being held without charges, Armesty International asked its volunteers to write on her behalf. Apparently, there was some confusion among the partners about whether planning commission approval was needed for both the restaurant and arcade portions.

Almost one year later, Vicini eccived a reply from the Urugunyan

received a reply from the Uruguayan government.

"Imagine my surprise when I opened my mail box last week to find in it a letter from a government official in Montevideo, Uruguay," she said.

"It was an exciting moment, ripping open the envelope, because I had not received a response before from my many messages on behalf of prison-ers."

many messages on behalf of prisoners."

In the past, leiters written by American Interest International volunteers have led to prisoners' releases around the world. A Dornicina Republican man was released in 1978 after some 3,000 leiters were sent on this behalf.

However, Vicin's leiter from Uruguay didn't contain the news of Echevarren's release.

"The letter had both good and bad news. Maria was getting medical care and a proper diet, but she was being held on charges of subversive activities," Vicini said.

"For the price of some postage atmps, you may save a life — dare to care," Vicini said.

"BY WRITING these letters we're showing them that citizens of the Unit-ed States have concern for others down

there."
Amnesty International was founded by Peter Beneason in 1961. Today there are 3,500 Amnesty groups throughout 140 countries.
The group has three goals, according to Vicini.

"The immediate release of prisoners of conscience, fair and prompt trials for political prisoners, and opposition to the death penalty and cruel, inhuman, and degrading treatment for all prisoners."

Annesty International's work is based on the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights, as well as other international instruments.

The group encourages volunteers to write as concerned private citizens, rather than members of Amnesty International. It also encourages the use of pen names, especially if the volunteer plans to visit a country they write to.
