Toxic dump information is available from DNR

There has been a lot of news lately about waste dumps and their danger to human health. How can I learn if there are any dumps where I live? How can I protect my family from these cancer-causing conditions?

While there is a tendency to focus on cancer-causing wastes, we should recognize that hazardous wastes come in many health-threatening forms and are not exclusive to waste dumps. Most households contain hazardous substances which are harmful including toxic substances, flammable substances and those that are corrosive and reactive.

The most important thing you can do to protect your family from these hazards is to become informed. An educated citizen can and will have an enormous positive impact on both the home and community environment.

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has identified waste dumps in Michigan. To receive a copy of their publication, "Inventory of Sites, the Assessment of Groundwater Contamination," write to: DNR Groundwater Quality Division,
