# Shoemaker resigns as Eaglet coach to seek 'new challenges'

Bob Shoemaker, the coach who di-rected Orchard Lake St. Mary's to two high school state basketball champion-ships, announced his resignation which will enable him to "look for another

In addition to his head basketball po-In addition to his head basketball po-sition, Shoemaker also held other du-ties at St. Mary's, among them athletic director and Dean of Men. His resigna-tion from the all-boys boarding school will become effective at the end of his contractual year, June 30. Shoemaker said. 'I feel I've done all I can do bere.'

During his six years, Shoemaker compiled a 124-25 won-lost record. His 1878 learn captured the Class D State Championship, while the 1882 squas won the Class C crown. In 1981, St. Mary's advanced to the semifinals before losing to Three Oaks River Valley.

ST. MARY'S defeated Reed City, 76-48, in the 1882 championship, and topped Detroit St. Martin dePorres, 67-52, in the 1978 final.
Prior to his job at St. Mary's, Shoomaker was a successful coach at Detroit St. Andrew, where he racked up a 93-17 record during his five-year carer. He has a career won-lost record of 217-42 for an 84-percent winning ratio.

As expected, the highlights in Shoe-maker's coaching career to date have been the two state basketball titles.

"50 many good things have hap-pened, but winning the state champion-nips certainly stand out, he said.
"Winning the state is the ultimate goal and a highlight was winning the first one. Then coming back and winning again in a different class, that's cer-tainly a highlight."

Although Shoemaker Insists his resignation is something be acted upon voluntarily, be said leaving St. Mary's will be difficult.

"I've had alx great years at this school, but this is something I feel I have to do." Shoemaker said. "I've had some great assistant coaches, and a lot

Mary's have been incredible; the best I've ever been associated with, and that's why it's going to be so difficult to leave."

The 1983-83 season was by far the worst record a Shoemaker-coached team has put together. In his four previous seasons at St. Mary's, his teams have posted records of 27-0, 22-3, 18-4, 21-3 and 24-3. His teams at St. Andrew were 15-4, 21-1, 19-6, 15-5 and 23-1.
