

Adams splits double-dip with West Bloomfield

Rochester Adams and West Bloomfield managed to squeeze a double-header in between the wet and cold weather on Friday and the snowfall Sunday as the teams split a twin bill Saturday afternoon.

Adams, paced by a strong six-inning pitching performance from Pat Semenkowski, won the first game, 5-4, while the Lakers exploded in a 15-3, five-inning victory in the nightcap. Semenkowski gave up three hits, three walks and fanned five in the game. Dave Penny pitched in relief in the seventh inning, and was spared the loss when West Bloomfield — with the bases loaded — lined into a game-ending double play.

"It was one of those games where you have a big sigh of relief afterward," Adams coach John Guerrieri said.

Matt Nosewicz was two-for-four with two runs batted in, and Craig Stempowski drove in three runs. Semenkowski had two hits in two trips.

Jim Hall drove in two runs for West Bloomfield, while Jeff George had another.

In the second game, West Bloomfield roughed up Highlander pitchers for 15 runs — all in the second inning — en route to an easy 15-3 win.

Todd Krumm was the winning pitcher as he went all five innings, scattered seven hits, walked one and struck out three.

George had the big blow of the game for West Bloomfield as he clouted a three-run homer. Bob Butler had a two-run double, and Zac Childress had three hits in four at bats.

Nosewicz was perfect in three trips for Adams, while Mike Smith had a two-run triple.

Both teams are 1-1 following the split. Adams is scheduled to play at Hazel Park Saturday in a 1 p.m. game against Clarkston. West Bloomfield is scheduled to host Lake Orion Friday at 4 p.m.
