

Sophomore Lauri Runk was a triple winner Thursday in Farmington Harrison's 81-42 win over Waterford Mott. Runk took the long jump in 14-8, the mile in 5:47 and the two mile in school record-breaking time of 12:50.

Senior Alice Short, an All-Stater a year ago, also racked up three firsts, hurling the discus 115-10 and the shot 41-2 to go with a win in the 110-yard low hurdles.
