



#### IS FIRBORITIS A FORM OF ARTHRITIS?

FORM OF ARTHRITIS?

At one time you may have come to a physician with problems of aching in many muscles and joints, convinced you had arthritis. However after the physician evaluated your case, he informed you that you didn't have arthritis, your problem was fibrositis. Fibrositis is a condition of the body's fibrous or connective tissue, the tissue functions much like coment does for bricks. Connective tissue holds together the muscles, tendons, and ligaritents that surround bones and joints.
