**RECREATION OPEN SWIM** — The spring session of recreational swimming began April 18 at North Farmington High School and will continue on Monday evenings through June 6. Swimming begins at 7 p.m. and continues to 9:15 p.m., however, adults have the pool to themselves beginning 8:15 p.m. Fee is 75 cents for children and teens and \$1 for adults. Open swimming requires that all children must be accompanied by a parent if their chin height is below 36 inches.

**FARMINGTON COMMUNITY CHORUS CONCERT** — The Farmington Community Chorus will be presenting its annual concert entitled, "Heard it on the Radio," beginning at 8 p.m. Saturday, April 30. The concert will include popular arrangements. The concert will be held at Harrison Centre for the Performing Arts, Harrison High School, 25995 W. 12 Mile. Tickets may be purchased from chorus members, at the Farmington Hills Parks & Recreation office or at the door. Adults \$2.50 and senior adults and students \$1.50.

**SENIOR ADULT RECREATION SWIM** — The Farmington Hills Parks & Recreation senior adult center offers open swimming every Monday, Wednesday & Friday at 9 a.m. The pool is located at the Mercy Conference Center, adjacent to the senior adult activities center. Bring your own suit, towel and lock. Fee for swimming is 50 cents.

**BOATING SAFETY CLINIC** — Farmington Hills, along with the Oak-

land County Sheriff's Department and the Department of Natural Resources, will host its annual boating safety clinic to be held 6-9 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday, May 10 and 12. You must attend both sessions. Pre-registration is mandatory at the Farmington Hills Parks & Recreation office. Fee is \$3. Registration deadline is May 6.
