events, is the creation of the Southfield Arts Council, which, for 12 years, has encouraged art in every form in the city.

INDEED, a "cultural revolution" has been openly courted by officials of the city, who spearheaded the building of the Pavilion, the sponsorship of the Artists' Cooperative and the development of the Parks and Recreation Department's Cultural Arts Division.

Nearly four years ago, Southfield became the only city in Oakland County where a full-time arts coordinator is employed by government. When the division began, there were six city-sponsored art programs. Today there are 72.

Those programs include Living Through Art, which affords handicapped and non-handicapped persons a barrier-free place to develop their talent and receive personal help, and Lively Arts for Little Ones, which delights the younger set. Quality entertainment is included.

Southfield enjoys three active symphonies, ballet, civic theater, and regular

exhibitions by area painters, sculptors, watercolorists, potters, photographers and glass artists.

ART IN PUBLIC PLACES brings fine examples of many media into city buildings. More than 200 pieces have been loaned or donated in the past two years.

The merger of business and the arts with the Corporate Consortium has brought art experiences and mini-concerts into Southfield's work places. A second phase of the Consortium's function will be to sponsor a sculptural walkway, a visual gift of art for all to see and enjoy.

The Artists Cooperative, headquartered in the historic Burgh area, has given the space glass blowers, watercolorists, weavers, potters or glass artists need to evolve into topnotch artists.

Art circles in Southfield are circles that most everyone runs around in. It's an environment in which you can see, touch, hear, feel, and be enriched by the fine arts without ever leaving your home town. The arts are alive and well here.
