Party politics good road for feminist reform

The women's movement won't lose momentum if state Rep. Mary Brown (Ri-Kalamazoo) can help it. She chairs the house committee on constitutional revision and women's rights and is author of the newsletter "Capitol: Woman."

Brown addressed more than 50 West Bloomfield-Farmington area League of Women Voters (LWV) at their annual inneeling last Saturday at Freddie's restaurant in West Bloomfield. "Get behind those closed doors, into

"Get behind those closed doors, into

with your party," said the woman, who
gave up her Western Michigan University professorabij to run for the state
house in 1976. "There's no special training to run for the legislature. There are
more teachers than anything else, even
lawavers.

"Get the diri under your fingernalis. Pay more attention to your courts. Women must take risks. We can pass good laws, but he judiciary must interpret them," said Brown, a former Kalamazo LWV prealdent.

BROWN ALSO SPOKE on the prob-lems with current Michigan laws.
"The laws of Michigan make it a more serious crime to steal property than to assault a woman. More than one of every four coovicted raplist was placed back in the community," Brown

placed back in the community." Brown said.

Her "rape bill" (which makes rape no longer a legal term) classifies that crime as sexual assault. It went into effect April 1. Sexual assault locreased 32.7 percent from 1976 to 1981 and 25 percent of those convicted were put on probation, Brown said.

"Rape convictions are up," she noted, but there is an increase in "date rape"

where the victim knows the rapist.
Another women's issue, abe said, is sexual harassment on the job.
"My experience with EEDC (Equal Employment Opportunity Commission) is that of 130 cases, 118 were demands for sex," said Brown. "It comes down to misuse of power."
She cites figures showing 20 to 25 percent of families have incidents of incest. "We're putting together a task force on incest. Almost all the victims are girls. Often the wife and mother deny it."

LWV MEMBERS garped when abe told of one mether admitting knowledge of the incert, asying, "At least be's not cheating on me."
Women vote differently than men on issues of war and peace and equal rights, Brown said.
"Some of us are not going to let up on the pressure. Women don't like to use power, but we're going to have to get into the political process, she said.
Brown attacked the inequality of wages.

She mosers at women like Phyllis Shaffley who imply women "ask for it" in cases of sexual barasament.

Blaming the victim is like asking in World War II, "what was Pearl Harbor doing there anyway?" she said.


