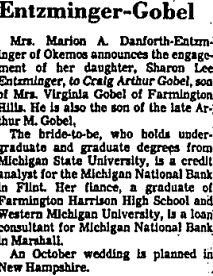

A May wedding is planned at St. Stephens Episcopal Church in Troy.



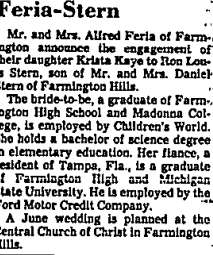
Entzminger-Gobel

An October wedding is planned in New Hampshire.



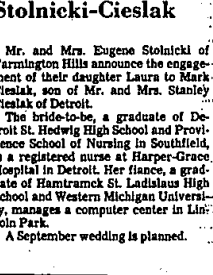
Lewis-Biathrow
