## Falcon girls lose 1st in prep track

Farmington High School lost its first track meet of the season as the Falcons girls were topped by Livonia Franklin, 59-54.

Farmington (2-1) was led by Linda Kietly and Annette Sulick. Kietly was first in the high jump (4-6) and 440 (5:52) while Sulick won the mile (5:52.2) and two-mile (13:02.5).

The mile relay team of Kietly, Lynn Looser, Kim Steiner and Laura Spence was first in 4:31.2. Looser also won the 880 (2:37.3).

Farmington's boys fell to 1-2 Tuesday with a 74-58 loss to Dearborn High.

Pete Brown was a double-winner as he won the shot put (51-11 1/4) and the discus (135-2). Doug Jenkins was the only other individual winner as he went 2:55.9 in the 880.
