

Mihelich hopes she'll top field in school race

Public relations specialist Elizabeth A. Mihelich makes her living making other people look good. These days, she's in need of her services.

Mihelich, who established her own freelance public relations business after stints as a teacher and magazine writer, hopes she'll look good to the voters in the June 13 school board election in Farmington.

Mihelich, 35 and single, is one of six candidates vying for a single opening on the Farmington Board of Education. The election's top vote-getter will serve a four-year term.

Asked why she wanted to serve on the board, Mihelich said, "I believe people have to give back to the community in which they're involved."

A native of northern Minnesota, Mihelich earned a bachelor's degree in English from the College of St. Catherine in St. Paul. Following graduation, she tried freelance writing in Minneapolis and then went to work for "TV Guide" magazine.

She also signed up for a hitch in the U.S. Army Reserve as a public information specialist.

Seven years ago, the magazine promoted her to regional editor and transferred her to Farmington.
