McConnell Disputes State Rules

FARMINGTON Robert McConnell, chairman of the Future Farmington Association, has filed a formal protest concerning the proposed administrative rules for the State Boundary Commission.

In a written brief to the commission, McConnell argues the administrative rules are, in part, illegal and go beyond the statutory authority

granted by the Legislature to the State Boundary Commission.

THE BRIEF ALSO argues that one particular rule, on finality of action, discriminates against McConnell as petitioner for cityhood for Farmington Township.

That rule states: "A record shall be made of all proceedings at an adjudicative ses-

sion. Commission action shall be regarded as final when the vote has been recorded although the commission's findings and order may not have been reduced to written form."

McConnell wrote commissioners that the rule is discriminatory because finality of order is one of the points being reviewed in the appeal now before Oakland County Circuit Court.

At issue in court is the meeting when the State Boundary Commission denied McConnell's petition for an incorporation vote.

After the commission's vote, McConnell submitted a substitute petition asking his incorporation request be converted into a consolidation petition.

The commission ruled that its action is final after the vote is taken and denied the substitute because it was filed too late. It could not substitute for a petition which no longer existed, the commission argued.

McConnell's position is that action of the Boundary Commission does not become final until reduced to a written order, and to his substitute petition should have been accepted.

McConnell also takes exception to the definitions of incorporation and consolidation

given in the commission's administrative rules.

THE COMMISSION'S general rules define consolidation as formation of a new city from:

(1) one city, one village and unincorporated territory; (2) one city and one village; (3) two or more cities; (4) two or more cities and unincorporated territory; (5) two or more villages and unincorporated territory; (6) two or more cities and one village; (7) two or more cities, one village and unincorporated territory; (8) two or more cities and two or more villages; (9) two or more cities, two or more villages and unincorporated territory; or, (10) one city and unincorporated territory.

Incorporation was defined simply as formation of a city

from: (1) unincorporated territory; (2) one village and contiguous unincorporated territory; or, (3) an incorporated village without change of boundaries.

Not included in the definition of incorporation was formation of a city from two villages and unincorporated territory -- which is what McConnell requested in his incorporation petition denied by the Boundary Commission.

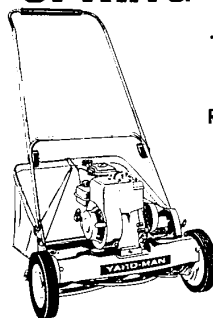

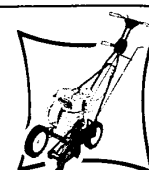
