They were concerned there wouldn't be enough time, or interest, or some other things.

But when a meet like the Anders event can go off so smoothly, there's no reason why in essence it couldn't serve as a district or regional for a state tournament.

And this is what likely will happen in the years to come Likely starting next year when from all indications Michigan's first state prep baseball tournament will be held.

JUST WHAT WILL happen to the Anders tourna-ment remains to be seen. We, for one, would like to see it remain a part of the prep baseball program. It's been the ONE event each spring which tied all the Observer schools together and the sponsors already have envisioned adding Southfield, South-field Lathrup and Brother Rice.

How to hold a state tournament and the Anders meet simultaneously naturally poses a question. But we have an idea.

For track they have the various invitationals every Saturday which lure the thinclads.

Saturday is a quiet day for prep baseball. Here and there a school plays.

So, what would be wrong if beginning with the first Saturday in May and continuing for three or four Saturdays. Observerland teams hold the Anders meet...and thus keep it alive?

It would add something extra to the spring program and we can't see why it would cramp the schedules of the various teams.

Every coach you talk to says he's all for playing as many games as possible. And a Saturday game or two wouldn't conflict with the regular-season, league schedules, etc.

It's just a thought...because those who have had anything to do with the Anders meet over the years would hate to see it fade from the picture.

Of course, its elimination would not come under the category of "a failure".

Instead, it would be bowing to PROGRESS...and who cah fault that?
