

Cranbrook 3rd at West Bloomfield net meet

Ann Arbor Huron won the third annual West Bloomfield Tennis Invitational over the weekend.

But that wasn't the real story.

The hottest newsworthy item from that competitive eight-team meet was that Cranbrook — the defending state class B champion and one of Michigan's most powerful tennis schools — finished third.

The Cranes had won the meet the past two years, but won only one flight and scored 22 points. Ann Arbor Huron won with 28 points and Birmingham Brother Rice was second with 26.

They (Cranbrook) had four players out testing for SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Tests), said West Bloomfield coach Greg Kopec. "It was a good journey at all levels."

"As the journey rolled down to the No. 1 singles match, both Huron and Rice were tied in points," he said. "And, whichever team won on No. 1 singles would win the match."

The singles winner was Ted Hakek of Ann Arbor Huron, who defeated

Rice's Eric Holey in straight sets, 6-1, 6-3.

Interestingly enough, the No. 1 singles winner at the West Bloomfield meet had gone on to win the state championship. Andover's Chip Bagley won the No. 1 crown two years ago and last year Ed Nagle took the title. Both went on to win the coveted No. 1 state class A singles championship.

Huron won the remaining three singles matches. Jonathan Morris won the No. 2 crown over Cranbrook's David Drew. John Zerweck defeated Seaholm's Paul Olmstead at No. 3, and Steve Hentschel topped Seaholm's Brad Pierce at No. 4.

Cranbrook's Charlie Moore and Greg Cain combined for a tough, three-set victory over Dave Barrett and Dave Cosgrove at No. 1 doubles. Ed Garcia and James McNulty of Brother Rice defeated Dave Janner and John Sotloff of Cranbrook at No. 2 doubles, 6-3, 6-2.

At No. 3 doubles, Rice's Kurt Steng and Mike Parks defeated Eric Kovan

and Doug Velick of Southfield-Lathrup in straight sets, 6-2, 6-1.

The remaining team scores were: Seaholm third with 17 points, followed by West Bloomfield (10), Southfield-Lathrup (nine), Bloomfield Hills Andover (five) and Rochester (two).

WEST BLOOMFIELD shut out Waterford Kettering to hike its overall record to 9-0 Monday.

The only singles player who lost a game was Kevin Donase who plays the No. 1 position. Joe Scavone, Jason Velick and Jay Rosette were all perfect.

Tom Warnick and Nick Scavone, Ron Vodka and Dave Michael and Burton Brodsky and Eric Bean were the winning doubles teams.

BERMINGHAM GROVES won only one of six matches against Southfield

The Knights were led by the No. 2 and 3 singles players, Dave Rivera and Joe Atkins. Rivera defeated Brian Dacic, 6-1, 4-6, 6-3, and Atkins defeated Bob Wagner, 6-3, 6-7, 6-0.

The other singles winners for Lahser were David Lee over Mike Harris and Tripp Mathies and Dan Karbowski in straight sets.

All three doubles teams won in the minimum two sets. Tim Sechowaki and sreene Tummla defeated Jeff Siegg and Eric Esser at No. 1 doubles. Disabled athletes from all over the state will compete in archery, weightlifting, table tennis, swimming, slalom, softball throw, pentathlon, javelin, club throw, discus, shot put, and various dashes, distance runs and relays.

The competition is open to all age groups. Participants, who must have the approval of the doctors, include amputees, paraplegics, quadriplegics, and those with polio, birth defects and cerebral palsy. Athletes do not have to be wheelchair users, but must compete in one.
