HE MAN who has chosen to help Birmingham acquire one of its largest birthday presents has been known and honored throughout the world.

Sculptor and local resident Marshall Fredericks has been awarded numerous honors from his father's native country of Denmark. He has also won the two most important sculpture awards given

in the United States.

He is an international figure who has studied in Germany, France, Sweden, Great Britain and Italy as well as taught at the Cranbrook Academy of Arts.

IN THE PAST, Fredericks has offered to donate to Birmingham the creative effort that went into sculpting one of his statues if the city could come up with the money to cast, transport and erect it. But his efforts have not met with success.

He was approached again earlier this year about the prospect, and he agreed.

The result is that the people of Birmingham have been given the chance to honor Fredericks — and at the same time honor themselves — by helping him place one of his statues in Shain Park for

the city's 50th anniversary.
