Cancer patients invited to "I Can Cope" classes

A patient education program designed to help people seek strengths and resources to cope with cancer and its therapies is being offered in Harper Grace Hospitals, Harper Hospital Division, Detroit, through the efforts of American Cancer Society volunteers.

The "I Can Cope" program series

which was developed at North Memorial Medical Center in Minnesota will be presented on eight consecutive Wednesdays from 6:30-8:30 p.m. May 25-July 13 in Harper Hospital Division, 3950 John R., 2 Webster North, Classroom 2. Upjohn Healthcare Services is providing additional funding assistance to initiate "I Can Cope" programs in various locations in the tri-county area.

The objectives of the patient education classes are three-fold: to increase the cancer patient's knowledge of the disease; to increase the cancer patient's control over his or her life; and to decrease the anxiety the cancer pa-

tient feels about the disease.

The program will be led by Anne K. Allen, patient educator coordinator, and Roseanne Ososki, patient care coordinator at Harper.

THE WEEKLY class sessions help participants increase knowledge about physical anatomy, cancer, potential health problems that may arise, nutrition, communication skills, stress awareness, physical fitness, utilizing community resources, and the essential role patients play in their own treatment.

Guest instructors include an oncologist, clinical dietitian, social worker, physical therapist and occupational therapist and community resource professionals.

Cancer patients and family members can register for the "I Can Cope" course by calling Harper Hospital Division, patient education 494-9082 or the American Cancer Society 557-5353. There is no fee but class size is limited and participants are expected to attend every class session.

Persons interested in courses given at other tri-county locations should require at the American Cancer Society.

Showhouse opens for tours

The second Detroit Symphony Showhouse will be open for tours May 24, through June 22 to benefit the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. The \$1.5-million, 25-room Showhouse is located in Bloomfield Township on the former James Couzens estate called Wabek, an Indian word which means "the best place."

Built by the Malcolm Leventen Corp., the new, 10,000-square-foot house will be decorated by 35 members of the Michigan Chapter of the American Society of Interior Designers (ASID), who will add some \$1 million in furnishings.

Among the home's outstanding features are an "island plantation" solarium and a three-story foyer with a curved oak staircase.

This fund-raiser for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra (DSO) is sponsored by the Detroit Symphony League, the Women's Association for the DSO and the Michigan Chapter of the American Society of Interior Designers.

The Showhouse is located at 1711 Morningside Way in Wabek North, Bloomfield Township. It is north of Long Lake Road between Middlebelt and Franklin roads.

Showhouse hours will be 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday; noon to 6 p.m. Sunday, and 6-9 p.m. Thursday. It is closed Monday.

Ticket prices are \$5 at the door. Groups of 30 or more will be admitted at \$3.50 per person. Tickets are available at Hudson's and other CTC outlets or by sending a stamped, self-ad-
