

# Credit unions elect officials

Area credit union representatives elected chapter officials last month at the annual meeting of the Oakland County Chapter of the Michigan Credit Union League (MCUL).

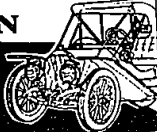

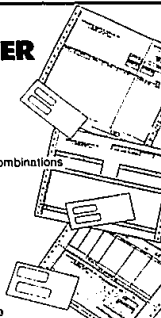
