

Lineup clears Hills suspect

West Bloomfield Police thought it caught a bicyclist who allegedly had threatened an 18-year-old woman resident with a knife as she walked along the Walnut Lake Road bicycle path near the Civic Center site.

But the woman failed to identify the bicyclist in a police line-up.

A young man on a bicycle approached her from the rear about 4 p.m. last Tuesday, initiating conversation, said Sgt. Mike Madigan.

After saying "Hello," he asked her if she had ever been kidnapped or tied up. When she attempted to move off the bike path, which was somewhat obscured by bushes, toward the road, he grabbed her arm with his left hand,

saying, "You're not going anywhere," Madigan said.

LOOKING BACK at him, she saw a knife with about a 1 1/2-inch blade in his right hand, according to police.

When she told him, "You'd better go, I'm calling police," he fled the area on his bike. Police could not find him.

Described as "clean cut and clean shaven," he reportedly was in his early 20s, of medium height and slender build, had medium skin color and black collar-length hair.

He was wearing a light blue shirt and dark blue jogging shorts with a white stripe, police said.

About 3:15 a.m. the next morning, Officer Greg Garwood saw a bicyclist matching that general description cross Pontiac Trail into the lighted area of the corner service station. But, "this man, a 17-year-old Farmington Hills resident, was slightly younger than described and had a mustache.

GARWOOD DETAINED him, and a police check determined the bicycle was reported stolen in Westland. He was carrying a light blue shirt and dark blue shorts with a stripe in a bag. A knife was found in his possession, Madigan said.

The man was charged with possession of stolen property, and questioned about the earlier incident. But, the victim could not identify him as the man because the man who accosted her didn't have a mustache, she said.

MANAGING YOUR ARTHRITIS Part I

There are a number of arthritic conditions and each requires a particular treatment; however, there are elements of management all types of arthritis have in common. First is acceptance. When you buy a home you accept a mortgage, a heavy obligation, which will be your responsibility for years. You must plan your expenses so that you will be able to meet your payments each month. A parallel situation exists if you have arthritis. Each day you are forced to structure your activities in order not to deplete your store of energy.
