

Registration begins for center's summer schedule

More than 60 classes, workshops and special events are offered in Farmington Community Center for a shortened summer session beginning the first week in June and running through July.

In-person registration in the center, 24705 Farmington Road, will be 8-8 p.m. Thursday. Mail and in-person registration will be accepted Friday and continue until class maximums are reached.

Registrants will find a range of subjects to fill leisure summer hours while developing new interests and skills.

Pat Donaldson will add two new workshops to her schedule, embroidery-trimmed baskets and holiday ornaments of counted thread techniques,

along with candlewicking, a returning favorite.

Artists will find workshops in watercolor landscape taught by Marge Chelstorp, landscapes in oil by Jerrine Hapsburg, Mary Bowman's oriental brush painting, and a new art program designed for teachers and parents taught by Karen Lyle. Monte Nagler will conduct a photographic outing on the community center grounds and nature trail as well as a six-session photography class.

The center's cooks, Judy Antishin and Barb Dermody, have whipped up two new cooking classes, "Souffle Success" and "Garden Gourmets."

OTHER New Workshops include "Computers for Small Businesses,"

"Sculpture Twining" for decorative baskets and wall hangings, and "Basics of Handwriting Analysis."

Basic flower arranging techniques to display summer blossoms can be learned in a special workshop taught by Nancy Passfield of Hill and Dale Garden Club. Students also will enjoy a tour of Sunshine Herb Farm conducted by Jean Riggs where they will see several theme gardens flourishing.

Summer classes emphasize exercise, leisure sports and self-improvement.

For improved posture, body control and a relaxed frame of mind the center offers Tai Chi and yoga beginning the first week of June. Outdoor enthusiasts may register for gold lessons to be given at Top of the Tee golf range or adult riding lessons at Haverhill Farms.

Other self-improvement classes include microwave cooking, Smoke No More stress management and computers. A new class in beginning wood carving will be taught to students 16 and up by Jo Ann Wood beginning Tuesday, June 14.

The center's summer roster also includes several classes and workshops for young people.

New this year are sessions on cooking, knitting, poetry, ceramics, and soft sculpture. Karen Lyle will help youngsters explore a variety of art media in an eight-session class, plus a two-session wire sculpture workshop in July.

Young people 10 years and older may also sign up for calligraphy, sewing or teen modeling.

DURING JUNE and July the center will stage several special events open to the public. Sunday, June 12, the center presents an Arts Festival with arts and fine crafts displayed for sale, entertainment, music, food and craft demonstrations. The Farmington Youth Band and the Farmington Community Concert Band will perform in the evening.

A tour of the Edsel and Eleanor Ford House including the newly opened second floor plus lunch at the Detroit Boat Club will be offered Thursday, July 14. Reservations for this trip must be made by Saturday, July 2.

"A Midsummer Night under the Stars" is offered in conjunction with Founders Festival activities. Martha Play open to boys and girls between 8-17 years.

The summer session will close with a special "Showing on the Green of Classic and Vintage Cars" following the Founders Festival Parade 1-4 p.m. Saturday, July 30.

The center's summer office hours are: Monday, June 13-Thursday, July 28, from 9 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday; Friday, July 29-Monday, Sept. 5, from 9 a.m. to noon Monday through Thursday. The center will be closed on Fridays and Saturdays except for special events.
