Criminal charges are being consid-ered in the traffic death of Andover High School sophomore Joseph Philip Shouneyia, who was killed Memorial Day when he was thrown from his car activities werving into a ditch following a

after swerving into a ditch following a collision. The Bloomfield Township teen, who celebrated his 16th birthday Jan. 2, al-legedly ran off the road when a 1980 Lincoin Coulinental, driven by Glenn Russell Johnson of Bloomfield Hills, pulled out from Lone Pine, then stopped in the middle of Inkster, West Bloomfield police said. Shouneyia was driving his 1983 Chev-rolet Camaro north on Inkater, ap-proaching Lone Pine, in West Bloom-field.

field. Johnson, 60, allegedly had been drinking, West Bloomfield police said. He took a Breathalyzer test, was ar-rested and taken to Oakland County Jail. He Inter was released. Police refused to give results of the Breathalyzer test.

Breathalyzer test. Shouneyia was pronounced dead at the scene. Death was caused by a head injury, according to preliminary autop-sy reports by an Oakland County medi-cal examiner.

Shouleyia was not wearing a back belt, are cogine caught fire as the channed, Madigan said. Johnson, an architectural engineer, was not injured and had only minor damage to bis car. SHOUNEYIA WAS a popular stu-dent, according to Bioomfield Hills An-dover High School counselor Jan King. "He had a lot of Iriends. His Iriends are deeply shocked and saddened. THE OAKLAND COUNTY Prosecu-tor's Office said it has requested fur-ther information, including a full au-topsy report and photographs, as it com-siders charges against Johnson. Charges which could be filed include manslaughter, negligent bomicide or drunk driving, the proscutor's office said.
