

Cranbrook 2nd in ball tourney; Falcons soar

A weary Cranbrook baseball team fell to Walled Lake Western in the finals of the George Gary Invitational Tournament last Wednesday, 8-1.

The Cranes, who were playing their eighth game in seven days, mustered just three hits in the finals against winning pitcher Dan Gabriele. Alan Daniels pitched the first three innings and took the loss.

Gabriele, a sophomore right-hander, struck out 12 Cranes and registered three straight complete games in the tournament. In the opener over Clarkston, Gabriele set a school strike-out mark of 16 batters.

"He (Gabriele) has professional velocity right now," said Cranbrook coach Jack Sanders. "He's a fine-looking pitcher."

"But, to win seven of those eight games is remarkable, and we were down only 3-1 going into the bottom of the sixth (against Western)," he said. "We have an unusual team with great fortitude."

Chris Hiltch had two hits and Paul Pijanowski had a single to account for Cranbrook's only hits.

AGAINST ATHENS, in Wednesday's semifinals, Cranbrook slipped to a 3-4 victory.

Roger Fenningdorf, with sixth-inning relief help from Jeff White, picked up the win. Steve Kangas took the loss for the Red Hawks.

Cranbrook scored the eventual game-winning runs in the fifth inning on a two consecutive wild pitches by southpaw Paul Lobos. The runs were scored by White and Pijanowski.

Hiltch and Pijanowski each had two hits for Cranbrook, which had a 5-0 lead entering the sixth inning.

Athens rallied for three runs in the sixth and one more in the seventh. The Red Hawks actually had the game-

tying run in scoring position in the last inning but couldn't bring the runner home.

Jon Draper, John Marana and Jeff Anderson each had two hits for the Red Hawks, who out-hit the Cranes, 8-5.

EARLIER LAST week, Cranbrook defeated Detroit Country Day in a wild, nine-inning game, 11-10. Cranbrook had 19 hits to DCD's 11.

Country Day held a 10-1 lead entering the fifth inning when the Cranes stormed back with seven runs with two outs. The inning was highlighted by seven singles and two walks.

The Yellowjackets made up the final two runs in the bottom of the seventh on a two-out, two-run single by Jon Doebr that tied the game. Doebr produced the eventual game-winning run in the ninth inning when he hit a bases-loaded single.

Hiltch had five hits in the game, and Cranbrook teammates Pijanowski, Doebr and Marcus Willis each had three hits. R.J. Haggerty picked up the win.

Country Day's offense was led by Richard Goldberg who had three hits. Erik Kakkonen and John Collins added two hits each.

Bill Murner was the losing pitcher.

FARMINGTON won a pre-district game recently over Milford, 2-1. The victory qualified the Falcons for district play held over the weekend in Plymouth.

The winning hurler in Farmington's victory over Milford was Paul Wenson who struck out 10. He also had the game-winning RBI.

Falcon teammate Jim Zaag added an RBI single.

The win left Farmington with an 11-9 overall record.

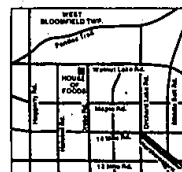

Four local players and a coach will be among the honorees at the 4th Annual Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan (BCAM) All-Star Festival in Kalamazoo June 17 and 18.

Named to the girls All-Star team is Carolyn Burt of Farmington Mercy. Her coach, Larry Baker, will be recognized as Class A Coach of the Year.

Boys All-Stars include Mike McCaskill of Southfield, named to the Class A East squad; and Damon Jones of Detroit Country Day and Hank Woodmore of Auburn Heights Avenale, both named to the Class BCD East squad.

THE FESTIVAL will feature the best of state high school basketball players and coaches. Three All-Star games will be played on June 18 at Reed Fieldhouse on the Western Michigan University (WMU) campus.

The girls All-Star game will lead off the featured action at 3:30 p.m. Sue

Tucker of Okemos will also receive the 1983 BCAM "Miss Basketball" award.
