OCC budget includes tuition hike for fall semester

The Oakland Community College Board of Trustoes last week adopted a \$3.8-million badget for the 1983-84 year.

The budget includes a tuition increase of \$1 per credit hour. The hike, which becomes effective in the fall semester, will raise in-district rates to \$23, out-of-district-rates to \$3 a credit hour and out-of-state rates to \$47 a credit hour.

THE GREATEST portion of the revenues comes from property lazes. Property owners pay \$14.1 million or 38.3 percent of the budget. In addition, \$12.7 million or 34.8 percent of the revenues are generated from tuition and fees. The administration was able to add \$500,000 to the revenue aide which was saved during prior years.

On the expenditure side, \$19.2 million or \$2.2 percent of the budget is spent on instructors' salaries.

salaries.
The next largest chunk of \$4.6 million or 13.5 percent will be spent for physical plant operations. Other expenditures include \$2.6 million for academic support, \$2.8 million for student services, \$498,000 for financial add, \$3.3 million for institutional support, \$28,000

for computer services, \$2.1 and \$512,000 for security.



"We do not anticipate any more employee layoffs this year because we keep growing." Cartsonis said.

OCCs enrollment has continued to increase although enrollments at K-12 schools and four-year colleges have declined. Current enrollment is above the 22,000 mark. The average student takes 8½ credit hours.

THE ADMINISTRATION outlined several objectives it hopes to achieve in the 1983-84

fiscal year. The highlights are:

• Developing and conducting conferences, seminars and other programs utilizing the High Tech Demonstration Center.

Establishing a foreign language institute to help those whose original languages were not English improve their proficiency.

Expanding the central warehousing operation, including computerized inventory control of both central stores and bookstores.

Negotiating labor agreements with the seven employee unions at the college.




