



Commissioners' SEMTA motion: more service or lose our support

A divided Oakland County Board of Commissioners is warning the Southeastern Michigan Transit Author-ity (SEMTA) to agree to Oakland's ser-vice demands or face the prospect that the county will back away from sup-porting a regional public transit pack-age.

And Oakland commissioners are in-sisting county votes be counted sepa-rately in any lax-like election so that any county in the six-county transit area could veto a regional tax hike. "We're not shaking our fist, we're protecting that little old lady from hav-ing her taxes raised without her vote,' said commissioner Lillian Moffitt, R-Bloomfield Township.

THE VOTE to give SEMTA until July 12 to accept Oakland's modifications was 19-7, with two Democrats joining all 71 Republicans. It was denounced by Commissioner Denais Aaron, D-Oak Park, as "a nail in the coffin of public transportation.

SEMTA HAS been told by the U.S. Department of Transportation to resolve regional bickering — largely between the city of Detroit, which favors light rail rapid transit and. Oaklind and Macomb counties, which don't — or no federal capital funds will be forthcoming.

SEMTA chairman Dewitt Henry of western Wayne County had been seeking to patch together an agreement between the factions, but the Oakland board attached its own set of conditions March 31 and is demanding SEMTA accept them.

Its resolution last week said the agreement would be "of no force and effect" if SEMTA fails to act on the Oakland demands by July 12.

"SEMTA will be out of money in November," said County Executive Daniel T. Murphy. "We have to do something soon. The feds require you to have a tax in place to cover operating deficits." The resolution was unveiled and pushed through the board in a single evening meeting without going through the committee process. Its authors—

"Oakland County can proceed on its own" if the federal government falls to give SEMTA capital funds for the 31 billion-plus project, said Rewold. "The monies are going to come to Oakland County one way or the other.

And laiter Rewold added. "It's not Oakland County not agreeing. It's the city of Detroit."

IN OTHER business, the Board of Commissioners last week:

• Unanimously supported abolishing the state' presidential primary, clining the \$5-plus cost per vote in 1980 and the 13 percent voter turnout.

• Gave 22-1 support to a resolution asking the Michigan Legisature to give a two-thirds vote to rescinding the 7.2 percent pay increase awarded it by the State Officers Compensation Commission.

• Agreed to pay up to \$123,000 to board Oakland's excess jall prisoners for three months in jalls of Washtenaw and Allegan counties.


