Tens of thousands will gather and enjoy a festival that only a few other communities in the area are able to have.

But this year is special. Festival celebration will start early, on June 14, (rain date is June 15) and it will give everyone a chance to help the festival for future years.

Tomorrow a new north-end business neighbor, Designer Depot, is throwing a big bash — "The Farmington Family Funfeast." And a feast of food and entertainment it will be for all who choose to show up 5-9 p.m.

EVERYBODY, naturally, is invited to the activities on Fourteen Mile and Middlebelt.

A bit of just about everything will be offered. CKLW's Tom Ryan will act as the evening's MC (wonder if Sam Sackowitz will be there?). Among the entertainment will be clowns, mimes, a pops concert by the Oakway Symphonic Band and show

tune medleys by the Farmington Community Chorus as well as the Macrombers, a musical show group of 24 vocalists and three instrumentalists.

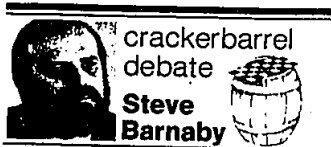

Mason is from Oregon where he was owner and managing director of a dinner theatre. He has previously taught at Creighton University in Omaha, Neb., and Riverside City College in Riverside, California. He spent two years as designer and director of the Riverside Children's Theatre Association.

Associated with theatre since 1965, Mason has bachelor and master degrees from the University of California.
