Diseases afflicting millions of Americans — dementia, including Alzheimer's disease — will be the subjects of a series of international symposia co-sponsored by the Veterans Administration and the University of Michigan Institute of Gerontology.

Five renowned European specialists in the field will present scientific papers and exchange observations with specialists and

gerontology trainees from many of VA's 172 medical centers.
