Big balloons celebrate first flight

Pitting a hot-air balloon has its fringe benefits. "We get to see some of the greatest parking lots in the world," said Jim Ahern.

Ahern pilots a yellow and white striped, seven-story balloon for Kraft foods. Some of the more famous parking lots where his balloon has been tethered, proclaiming on its side 'Parkay — the flavor says butter, include those at the Kentucky Derby, the Preakness and the Mard Gras.

United States, of which 1,000 fly com-petitively. The top 100, based on a year-long points system, qualify for the U.S. title.
