

Stop and Frisk Law Passed In Detroit

DETROIT — The controversial stop and frisk ordinance has been approved, 5 to 2, by the Detroit Common Council. But there is speculation that Mayor Jerome Cavanagh might veto the ordinance.

The stop and frisk law as approved contains three sections. The first says a police officer can stop and question a person when "the behavior of an individual warrants further investigation."

The second says he can conduct a "limited search," meaning a frisk or a seizure of dangerous weapons. He can then either make an arrest or set the suspect free.

The third section requires police to take special care in protecting civil liberties and individual dignity.

DETROIT — The Paper and Plate Industries Union has voted to accept the \$33-for-34 1/2-month settlement with management of the Detroit News and Detroit Free Press.

The approval made the union the first in the printing crafts to accept general terms negotiated by Dr. Nathan Feinsinger, mediator.

The Teamsters Union earlier had accepted the general formula.

LANSGING — The controversial Sunday liquor bill is now in the laps of county boards of supervisors after Gov. George Romney permitted the bill to become law without his signature.

Romney, a non-drinking Mormon, said he declined to veto the measure despite his personal feeling that "this would be a much better world if there was no consumption of alcoholic beverages."

The bill which becomes effective immediately, authorizes county boards to legalize sale of liquor by establishments which derive at least half their gross receipts from sale of services or goods other than liquor.

STANFORD, Calif. — Arjay Miller, a 20-year Ford Motor Co. executive, will leave his post as vice chairman of the board next July 1 to become dean of the Stanford University graduate school of business. The announcement was made last week by the university.

Miller, 52, of Ann Arbor, had served as Ford president until Sen. Ron Reagan came over from General Motors to assume the Ford presidency and Miller was elevated to the vice chairmanship of the board.

WASHTENAW COUNTY — Robert F. Thompson, a former Ypsilanti urban renewal director, pled guilty in Washtenaw County Circuit Court last week to fraudulently obtaining signatures on a contract for sale of real estate.

The contract dealing involved William Schumacher, a builder, involved in an urban renewal program.

FLINT — Approximately 2,800 Buick Motor Co. plant employees were laid off for three days after an explosion ripped through the Flint plant burning one man on the neck last week.

A faulty pilot light in a gas oven apparently allowed gas to accumulate in the oven, then exploded. There was no fire, authorities reported.

The blast on Flint's northeast side knocked out glass panes and steel window frames on the plant's third and fourth floors. No damage estimate was given by company officials.

LANSGING — State Atty. Gen. Frank J. Kelley ruled that there was legally no conflict of interest in the acquisition and

sale of property near the Michigan State University campus by MSU President John A. Hannah.

However, Kelley observed, "there are potential dangers in permitting officers of state institutions to acquire real estate in close proximity to the very institution in which they exercise their delegated powers."

EAST LANSING — Gov. Romney has given his approval to the city to place on the Nov. 5 ballot a proposed amendment to the city charter to permit the sale of alcoholic beverages.

Approval must also be received from the office of the attorney general before the question can legally be placed on the ballot.

If approved by East Lansing residents, the proposed amendment would permit the sale of alcoholic beverages in hotels and motels where there are more than 50 sleeping rooms, a public dining room and a general kitchen.

LANSGING — Declaring it "is not too much to ask" that bars be separated from churches and schools by 500 feet, Gov. Romney last week vetoed a bill that would have repealed the physical barrier.

Romney rejected the measure that would have allowed establishments now licensed to sell beer and wine to peddle liquor if they are located within 500 feet from a church or school.

LANSGING — The State Administrative Board has awarded a two-year state printing contract to Speaker-Printers & Thomas, Inc., of Lansing for \$1,583,878.

Included in the contract is book printing, forms, letter heads and envelopes, Conservation Department House forms and law digests and the Conservation Department magazine, "Michigan Conservation."

LANSGING — Last week Gov. Romney signed into law five special housing measures — four of the five deal with tenants' rights.

Romney called it "the most significant package of breakthrough legislation in Michigan history."

LANSGING — A proposal for a \$100-million state bond issue for money to carry out major expansions of the state's public recreation facilities next year will go before Michigan voters this November.

"With this bond issue," Gov. Romney said, "we can expand our state park system with 6,000 new campsites and day-use parking space for 16,000 more cars, which will enable us to serve an additional 189,000 people every day."

SAGINAW — City firemen staged a slowdown last Monday, refusing to perform any routine jobs other than fighting fires and answering emergency calls.

DETROIT — Three occupants of a private plane that crashed into a building on the city's east side last week remain in serious condition in the hospital.

Authorities said the plane ran out of gas while circling the Detroit River to view a fireworks display and crashed about a mile from the City Airport.

The pilot, Fred Hargrave, 23, of Pontiac, passed away. Josephine Peterson, 19, of Rochester, Mary Shourin, 21, of Pontiac remain in the hospital while Paul Shourin, 24, was treated and released.
