A runaway tractor-type power mower left a 75-year-old Farmington Township man seriously injured this week after dragging him over an embankment and holding him helplessly pinned for more than 20 minutes.

Russell O. Gaston, 26415 Drake Rd., told police he was cutting the lawn at the rear of his home about 4 p.m. July 2 when the machine went out of control.

The tractor ran over his body resulting in a compound fracture of the right leg, severe injury to the left shoulder and arm, plus numerous bruises and abrasions on the body.

Baker is an honorary life member of MSPA. He graduated from the Detroit Institute of Technology, now Wayne State University.

In 1964, he received the A.H. Robins "Bowl of Hygieia" award in Michigan for outstanding community services. In 1966, the representative received the Distinguished Service Citation from the Wayne State University College of Pharmacy Alumni Association.

HE HAS served on the MSPA legislative committee since 1962. He has also served on the legislative committee of the American Pharmaceutical Association from 1965 to 1967 and was its chairman in 1966-67.

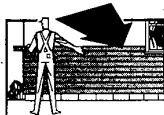
