Artist To Talk Sept. 11

Richard Kozlow, well known Michigan artist, will be the guest speaker at the Sept. 11 meeting of the Farmington Art Club.

Kozlow, a self-taught artist, pursued careers in both painting and commercial art until 1960 when he turned his full attention to painting.

One of the earliest prints is a woodcut titled "The Zodiac Man," which was published in Venice in 1493. Among the best-known is Rembrandt's "Christ Healing the Sick," sometimes called "The Hundred Guilder Print" because it sold for that remarkable price in the 17th century.

"Ars Medica" will undergo "diagnosis" by Dr. Irving F. Burton and Dr. Alfred Golden in a slide-discussion Tuesday, Sept. 24 at 8 p.m. Both doctors, residents of Huntington Woods, are knowledgeable art collectors, so they will combine knowledge of their vocation and avocation in lively commentary.
