Two Hurt In Crash On 10 Mile

Drivers of both vehicles involved in a two-car automobile crash Wednesday in Farmington Township suffered injuries requiring hospitalization.

The driver of the 1967 Buick Wildcat, James R. Slattery, 24, of Baltimore, Md., and Martha Truff Mungar, 46, of Walpole Lake, there were no passengers in either car.

Township police said that statements from the two motorists indicated that Mrs. Mungar, who was northbound on Hagerty Rd., stopped for a red light at the intersection of 10 Mile Road and did not observe Slattery's car moving east on 10 Mile.

When Mrs. Mungar drove into the intersection she was struck by the slatery vehicle which police said was traveling at 40 miles per hour. Slattery told police the slatery car woman drove in front of him and he was unable to stop to avoid the accident.

Both were treated at Botsford General Hospital.

Glue-Sniffing Jails Two

Two Detroit men were found guilty of glue-sniffing by Farmington Township Justice of the Peace Byron Walters but escaped conviction for shoplifting when the charges were dismissed.

James D. Grien, 24, was arrested when a Michigan State Police trooper spotted him with a plastic bag up to his mouth driving west on I-96 just beyond the Grand River interchange.

An analysis from the Michigan Department of Health showed the plastic bags contained a substance found in rubber cement. A tube of rubber cement and a roll of baggies were found in the car at the time of arrest.

Grien and his passenger, Kenneth D. Luke, 20, were fined \$100 plus \$25 costs and placed on a year's probation. Luke was sent to Oakland County Jail for 30 days or until the fine is paid.
