Theater school students to perform for audience

Young theater-students who have been studying out-of-doors at the Cranbrook Summer Theatre School will get a chance to show what they've learned when they present their first full-scale production next week.

"Twelve Dancing Princesses" — replete with village maidens, peddars, a mystic, constables, governesses, ladies-in-waiting, heralds, a king, prince and 12 princesses — will be performed at 8 p.m. Wednesday, July 27, and Thursday, July 28, at the outdoor Greek Pavilion at Cranbrook in Bloomfield Hills. Tickets at \$2 are available by calling 644-9868, or at the door, 400 Lone Pine Road.

Throughout the summer, students from 9 through college age, have been building experience through a variety

of theater classes. The younger students, age 9-13, have studied speech, pantomime and dance and performed in one-act plays, as part of a six-week program. "The Twelve Dancing Princesses" is their finale to the season.

OLDER STUDENTS, from 14 to college age, also have performed short plays and taken classes in makeup and stage direction, along with the basics, during a five-week term. They will do three plays at the Greek Theatre in August.

Castles and the Land of Silver and Gold set the stage for "The Twelve Dancing Princesses." The school's technical director, Dennis Shepherd, and his staff designed and built the sets.

Fiber artist Jane Knight, who has done commissions for a Saudi-Arabian king as well as Renaissance Center, designed costumes for the production.

The play is an original script by the late Carl G. Wonnberger, founder of the 42-year-old Cranbrook Summer Theatre School. Annetta Wonnberger, the school's director, is also its co-founder.

In "Twelve Dancing Princesses," members of the cast alternate one night in a speaking part and the other in a dancing part. This way the show can go on, if necessary, without the use of stand-ins.

THE PROFESSIONAL staff teaches theater arts to provide the students with a knowledge of discipline, graceful movement and teamwork.
