Despite the innocent and almost fairy tale sound of its name, ELF is no little thing. For those not familiar with Project ELF, the three letters stand for extreme-low-frequency. This frightening fact atone would seem to undercut any moral justification for ELF on grounds of national defense.

Justification is offered on such film-sy grounds as the fact that it will offer jobs in Michigan. That happens to be true. The projected number of jobs is about 200, a very small number when one considers the ELF price tag to the taxpayers of some half a million dol-lars.




