## Auto history library largest in the world

The National Automotive History Collection housed at the Detroit Public Library is the most comprehensive collection in the world, with more than a million cataloged items.

The collection serves the historical needs of writers, researchers, social historians, students, hobbyists and the news media. Visitors come from all over the country and from other nations.

The cataloged items are estimated to weigh about 200 tons and now a group of 25 retirees from automotive compa-nies and their advertising agencies has volunteered to affith the other has been added to affith the other in boxes and crates in a dusty closed-off section of the original library.

"It's a mess," one of the volunteers told the Southfield-based Automotive Information Council (AIC). "Many of the boxes have not been opened in 20 years. We don't even know what's in them."

"It's a labor of love and keeps us active in the auto industry," said another. While he was laiking, a volunteer was going through glass negatives of Packard cars dating from 1910 and another had just uncovered a 1916 catalog.

Because of a money shortage, the unsorted and uncataloged material remained covered with dust for several years until 1980 when the Smithsonian Institution in Washington told the Friends of the Library it would like to buy the collection, but the offer was never followed up. That's when the volunteers swung into action.

The effort of these people will keep the history of the auto industry living forever, said AIC.
