In a program just announced by vice-Chancellor Eugene Arden, qualified candidates will pay only the basic \$50 enrollment fee. All utilion charges, typically \$200-\$250 for a three-credit course, will be underwritten on the basis of a scholarship.

This is an opportunity for people who haven't stepped inside a college classroom for perhapa 40 years to resume studies at a modest cost, in some cases to update their business or professional skills.
